Hello all,

We've had a summer break since our last meeting, so this is a slightly earlier reminder than usual about our next outing. Again we meet at Ynyslas, but this time we will venture onto the saltmarsh. So please dress appropriately, noting the advice below about wellies, and be prepared for a sea breeze and other weather.

Sunday 21st September at 10am: Flora of Dyfi Saltmarsh NNR

Meeting place: Ynyslas Visitor Centre on the Dyfi National Nature Reserve. County Botanical Recorder Steve Chambers will lead a walk to look at saltmarsh plants such as Glasswort, Sea-Blite, Sea-Spurrey, Sea-Aster, Thrift, Sea-Milkwort, Sea-Arrowgrass and specialist grasses and rushes, with the likelihood of wildfowl and waders also. Wellies are advised.

Directions: From the village of Ynyslas take the minor road directly north for 1.75km to the parking area on Borth Sands. High Tide is at 8:44am, so the waters will be receding when we park. From the information board, follow the footpath through the dunes to the Visitor Centre SN610941 (what3words: ///privately.stupidly.natively). https://naturalresources.wales/days-out/places-to-visit/mid-wales/dyfi-national-nature-reserve-ynyslas-visitor-centre/
